HISTORIC TWIN CITY iraymont - neighboring, rival, and nearly iraymont - neighboring.

Summit and Graymont - neighboring, rival, and nearly identical towns got "married" in 1921 and formed Twin City. Logging established both towns, and train lines were built to move the inher. Changes frought by the Great Depression shifted the commercial center of the area from Twin City to Swainsboro, a move that helped preserve original neighborhoods, making Twin City at time capsule for historic architecture. An 1830's log cabin, Victorian cottages, gabled ells, Craftsman, English venaculat, attached front commercial, and Italianate are but a few of the styles that can be discovered as one walks through the Twin City Historic District. Though the trains stopped running and the rails were taken up in the early 1990's, Twin City remains an excellent example of a railroad strip town, and it holds a unique and important place in Georgia's history.

Come for a visit or stay for a lifetimed. The little city with a big history that's twice as friendly, twice as nice!

GEORGE L. SMITH II STATE PARK
George I. Smith State Park is a jewel in the Georgia State Park System. It is home to one of only two grisimills in working order and in operation by the state of Georgia; for history built be mill itself is worth a visit to the park. The dam, completely built by hand at the greatest depth of water, was considered an engineering miracle in its day.

The park boasts 1,634 arcs of land and 412 acres of lake to explore. For campers, there are tent, trailer and RV campsites, as well as primitive camping. For the less adventuous, there are contages, pionis shelters, a group shelter that seats 50, and playgounds. The Mill Pond is great for fishing, canoeing, and has the best "pinhall-kayaking" in Georgia. Seven miles of trails beckon hikers, runners, and cyclists.

For nature lovers, George L. Smith State Park is home to an abundance of wildlife from his to rare gopher tortoises easily observed and enjoyed by all acres.
